Ordinance No. 223

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING CHAPTER 2 SOLID WASTE AND ITS SUBPARTS AND ANY OTHER PROVISIONS THAT CONFLICT, AND ADOPTING CHAPTER 2 SOLID WASTE INCLUDING SECTIONS 1: DEFINITIONS; 2: SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL SITES; 3: SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL; DELIVERY; AND 4: PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Twin Falls County, Idaho, deems it necessary to protect and promote the public health, safety and community welfare of Twin Falls County.

WHEREAS, a draft of this ordinance was considered by the Twin Falls Board of County Commissioners at a duly noticed public hearing on the 4th day of November, 2011.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF TWIN FALLS COUNTY, IDAHO:

The Board of County Commissioners of Twin Falls County, Idaho hereby adopts the following as Twin Falls County Code Title 4 Chapter 2 Section 1 Definitions, Section 2 Solid Waste Disposal Sites, Section 3 Solid Waste Disposal; Delivery, and Section 4 Penalties for Violation

**4-2-1: DEFINITIONS:**

**COMPOSTING:** Biological decomposition of organic matter. It is accomplished by mixing and piling in such a way to promote aerobic and/or anaerobic decay. The process inhibits pathogens, viable weed seeds and odors.

**COMPOSTING, AGRICULTURAL:** Large scale production of compost intended for agricultural use at or near the composting site. Agricultural composting operations shall comply with local zoning requirements and shall be approved by the Idaho Department of Agriculture.

**COMPOSTING FACILITY, COMMERCIAL:** Facility for the large scale production of compost intended for sale and use on premises other than that where such compost is produced. Commercial composting facilities shall be approved by the South Central District Health Department and shall comply with local zoning requirements. Agricultural service composting is not included.

**COMPOSTING, PRIVATE:** Producing compost, not for sale, on a parcel less than five (5) acres, not to exceed ten (10) cubic yards at any particular time, for use on the same premises where such compost is produced.

**CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION DEBRIS:** Waste building materials, packaging and rubble resulting from construction, remodeling, repair and demolition operations on pavements, houses, commercial buildings and other structures. Such waste includes, but is not limited to, carpet, carpet padding, bricks, concrete, masonry materials, soil, rock, lumber, road spoils, rebar, paving materials and tree stumps. Noninert wastes and asbestos wastes are not considered demolition waste.

**RECYCLABLE MATERIALS:** Materials that still have useful physical, chemical or biological properties after serving their original purposes and can, therefore, be reasonably reused or recycled for the same or other purposes. Recyclable materials shall be considered solid waste for purposes of this chapter, if they are not actually recycled.

**RECYCLING CENTER:** A facility where recyclable materials are collected, sorted, flattened, crushed or bundled for shipment to reprocessors and reusers of the materials. Automobile salvage yards may be considered recycling centers for the purposes of this chapter. Recycling centers shall comply with all other provisions of county code.

**RECYCLING PLANT:** A facility where recyclable materials are reprocessed and/or reused from their waste form into new products or raw materials. Recycling plants shall comply with all other provisions of county code.

**SOLID WASTE:** means any garbage, refuse, discarded material, including solid, liquid, semi-solid, or contained gaseous material resulting from industrial, commercial, mining, and agricultural operations, and from community activities, but does not include solid or dissolved materials in domestic sewage, or solid or dissolved materials in irrigation return flows or industrial discharges that are point sources subject to permits under other applicable law or regulation. Solid waste includes, but is not limited to household garbage, tires, scrap metal, old paints, furniture, toys, discarded appliances, vehicles, empty aerosol cans, paint cans, compressed gas cylinders, construction and demolition debris, asbestos, and yard waste.

#### **4-2-2: SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL SITES**

- A. Solid Waste Disposal Sites for the disposal of garbage, rubbish, or other refuse shall be established at such places as the Twin Falls County commissioners may from time to time designate by motion or order and those sites are hereby designated the official disposal sites.
- B. No person shall dispose of solid wastes anywhere in Twin Falls County except at the official disposal sites, approved for the type of solid wastes disposed, and designated by the Twin Falls County board of commissioners. (Ord. 16, 9-15-1969, eff. 10-1-1969)
- C. Solid Waste Program: The Twin Falls County commissioners may appoint a director to administer the solid waste program. The director would coordinate, enforce, and set up such programs with the assistance of the State Board of Health and/or the Department of Agriculture. (Ord. 16, 9-15-1969, eff. 10-1-1969).

#### **4-2-3: SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL; DELIVERY:**

- A. Delivery Of Solid Waste To District's Sites: From and after November 1, 2002, all solid waste collected from any source or location within Twin Falls County, Idaho, whether collected by the county, any incorporated city, or by any commercial collector of solid waste, shall be delivered to the approved transfer station(s) or other solid waste disposal or resource recovery site(s) within or designated for the use of the county by the Southern Idaho Regional Solid Waste Disposal District or its successors or assigns.
- B. Deposit of Solid Waste is permitted at official disposal sites only.
- a. Dumping Prohibited: No person shall throw, discard, or deposit any solid waste or refuse in or upon premises, improved or vacant, either public or private, unless said premises is an official disposal site. No person shall throw, discard, or deposit any solid waste upon any roadway, street, alley, sidewalk or vacant ground, or in or upon any canal, irrigation ditch, drainage ditch or other watercourse.
  - b. Accumulation prohibited. All persons shall maintain their property or premises in a sanitary condition, free from solid wastes. No person or persons, business, corporation, or other entity (except for authorized or designated sites which comply with all federal, state and local laws) shall allow solid wastes or refuse to be maintained on any premises, lot or property under his or her ownership or control. Solid waste may be stored for no more than fourteen (14) days pending transport to a designated disposal site.
  - c. It shall be a violation of this ordinance to deposit solid waste on the property of another or to allow solid waste to accumulate on a person or entity's own property.
- C. Recyclable materials: shall be stored, handled and disposed of only at authorized or designated sites which comply with all federal, state and local laws. Recyclable materials may be stored by individuals, businesses, corporations, or other entities pending transport to a recycling center, recycling plant or designated site for no more than one hundred eighty (180) days. The transport and delivery of recyclable materials shall be in compliance with all federal, state and local laws. Recyclable materials shall be considered solid waste for purposes of this chapter if the materials are not taken to a recycling center or recycling plant within one hundred eighty (180) days.
- D. Private composting is allowed. Compostable materials are not required to be taken to disposal sites, provided that the materials are currently being composted and the composting is in compliance with all other applicable laws and regulations. Commercial and Agricultural Composting is allowed subject to zoning restrictions and all other applicable laws and regulations.
- E. Solid Waste Transportation: No person shall cause or permit a vehicle used to haul or transport solid waste to be so loaded, or to be of such construction or condition, so as to permit any of the solid waste to drop or fall upon or in any street or public way.

#### **4-2-4: PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION**

A. For a violation of this Chapter the County may pursue any one or more of the following actions:

- a. See voluntary compliance;
- b. Issue a civil citation (infraction);
- c. Pursue a civil action to enforce compliance with the terms of this Chapter or to enjoin, restrain or abate any violation of the terms of this Chapter; or to seek any other appropriate remedy.
- d. Pursue criminal prosecution

B. GENERAL PENALTIES: Violations of the Chapter are punishable as follows:

- a. For a first violation the violator will be deemed guilty of an infraction and shall pay the fixed penalty of fifty dollars (\$50).
- b. For a second violation within two years, the violator will be deemed guilty of a second offense infraction and shall pay the fixed penalty of one hundred dollars (\$100), notwithstanding that the solid waste involved may or may not be the same solid waste as was involved in the previous violation.
- c. For a third violation within two years, the violator will be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and may be fined up to one thousand dollars (\$1,000) and may be jailed for up to 6 months, notwithstanding that the solid waste involved may or may not be the same solid waste as was involved in the previous violation.
- d. Each day of continuing violation may be assessed as a separate violation.

Repeal of Conflicting Provisions and Severability: This ordinance hereby repeals all provisions of TFCC which conflict with the provisions of this Chapter. Irrespective of the basis of the invalidity, if any term or condition of this ordinance is invalid the remaining terms and conditions of this ordinance are severable.

Effective Date:

This ordinance shall be effective upon passage and publication as provided by law.

WHEREAS, The Urban Renewal Agency of the City of Twin Falls is proposing to adopt an urban renewal plan covering approximately two hundred twenty (220) acres of land located south of Kimberly Road, west of 3300 East Road, and north of the railroad right-of-way; and,

WHEREAS, The urban renewal plan includes a revenue allocation financing provision; and,

WHEREAS, A portion of the land (66.38 acres) within the proposed revenue allocation area that is located outside the city limits, but inside Urban Renewal Area #4; and,

WHEREAS, The proposed Urban Renewal Plan for Revenue Allocation Area #4-3 cannot be extended later, to include the parcel outside the city limits, due to the limitations imposed in Idaho Code §50-2033; and,

WHEREAS, Idaho Code §50-2906(1) provides that the revenue allocation financing provision will not be effective if an urban renewal area or revenue allocation area extends outside the municipal boundary if a transfer of powers ordinance has not been adopted by the county.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF TWIN FALLS COUNTY, IDAHO:

Section 1: The Board of County Commissioners hereby declares the need to transfer powers necessary under the Urban Renewal Law (Idaho Code §50-2001, et seq.), and the Local Economic Development Act (Idaho Code §50-2901, et seq.).

Section 2: The Board of County Commissioners hereby transfers only those powers necessary under the Urban Renewal Law (Idaho Code §50-2001, et seq.), and the Local Economic Development Act (Idaho Code §50-2901, et seq.). That the real property is described as follows:

A parcel of land located in Section 24, Township 10 South, Range 17 East, Boise Meridian, Twin Falls County, Idaho, being more particularly described as

follows: The South half of the NE¼ that lies north of the railroad right-of-way boundary. Containing approximately 66.38 acres

Section 3: That this Ordinance shall be null and void if the urban renewal plan and revenue allocation area, referred to above, are not established within one year of the date of adoption of this Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF TWIN FALLS COUNTY, IDAHO, READOPTING THE CITY OF TWIN FALLS COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AND LAND USE MAP, TOGETHER WITH THE CITY OF TWIN FALLS ZONING AND SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS AND AREA OF IMPACT AND ZONING DISTRICTS MAP, FOR APPLICATION IN THE TWIN FALLS CITY AREA OF IMPACT.

WHEREAS, In 2004 the City of Twin Falls and County of Twin Falls adopted, by ordinances, regulations for the Area of Impact for the City of Twin Falls; and,

WHEREAS, The County's ordinance has been codified in § 8-9-19(B) of the Twin Falls County Code; and,

WHEREAS, § 8-9-19(B)(3)(a) of the Twin Falls County Code adopts the Twin Falls City Comprehensive Plan and Map, and the Twin Falls City zoning and subdivision regulations, and zoning districts map, for application in the Twin Falls City Area of Impact; and,

WHEREAS, Since 2004, the City of Twin Falls has adopted some changes to the Comprehensive Plan and Map, and to the zoning and subdivision regulations, which changes may be applicable to the Area of Impact; and,
